PTA Fundraisers Are A Success!

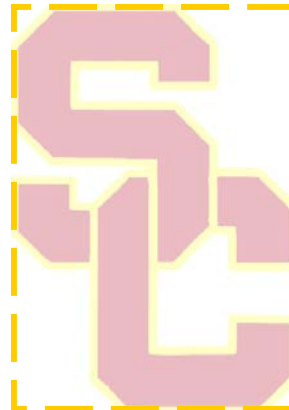

Daily Pick-up — Tips & Suggestions for Picking up Your Student

Fire lane/Parking Suggestions

We would like to remind our school community that cars should not be left unattended in the fire lane! You are encouraged to park in the parking lot and walk your child to the school, or walk to meet them at the end of the day.

Parents of kids in kindergarten and grade 1 can line-up in the "pick-up" lane to drop-off or pick-up your child. Due to the size limitations of this lane, we can not allow parents of children in grades 2

through 4 to wait here for child-pick-up.

If you have a documented medical reason why you or child can not walk from Parking Lot A to the school, please contact the principal and additional arrangements will be made.

If your child is staying for any after school activity, pick-up is set for the South side of the building, where there is plenty of parking and good lighting for those nighttime events!

Also, if you haven't noticed, we

have two new additional handicap parking spaces, two parking spaces for expectant mothers, and one new parking space with a time limit of 15 minutes. This is intended to be used by parents involved in activities that require short visits to the school.

PS — We're working on an online system that will track student drop-off and pick-ups!

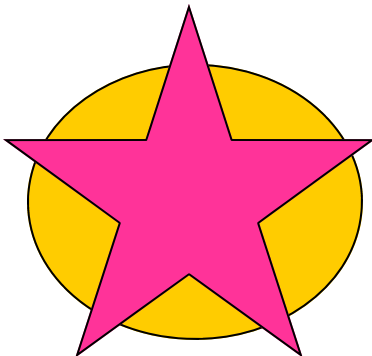
